Course Description

This course teaches students how to take a more objective (scholastic) approach to reading and writing while honing the techniques for persuasive and compelling narrative writing developed in previous coursework.* The class will culminate in the completion of a biography project (min 25 pages). The project consists of three chapters (biographies) of individuals who have something in common, and an essay that discusses this commonality.

Topics will include:

- Reading across a range of texts
- Analyzing and evaluating texts
- Using a variety of technological and informational resources to conduct research
- Using a variety of writing techniques to persuade, engage, and convey information
- Planning for and sustaining a longer project (3 chapter biography)

Program Objectives:

In studying the biography, students are exposed to a diverse array of texts. They learn the basics of writing a research paper: consideration of sources, the weighing and presenting evidence, documentation, and analysis. These skills are critical for success in high school English and History classes. Finally, a small component of the class also exposes students to the critical thinking skills required for standardized test prep.
